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Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. led the American Civil Rights Movement from December 1955 to April 4, 1968, preaching a philosophy of non-violent protest, grassroots organizing, and civil disobedience.

Dr. King was born into a religious family. His grandfather and father were pastors of the Ebenezer Baptist Church in Atlanta, Georgia. Dr. King drew on his faith for his principles and spoke frequently about his duty to God.

Dr. King attended segregated public schools in Georgia, and then attended Morehouse College, an African-American institution in Atlanta, from which both his father and grandfather had graduated. Dr. King then studied theology for three years at the Crozer Theological Seminary in Pennsylvania where he was elected president of a predominantly white senior class. He then enrolled in graduate studies at Boston University, completing his residence for the doctorate in 1953. In Boston, he met and married Coretta Scott, a young woman studying at the New England Conservatory of Music. They would have two sons and two daughters.


By 1954, Dr. King was a member of the executive committee of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), and the pastor of the Dexter Avenue Baptist Church in Montgomery, Alabama. When the Montgomery bus boycott began in 1955, Dr. King became one of the leaders of the movement.

The Montgomery bus boycott became one of the most successful non-violent demonstrations in modern history. During the boycott, Dr. King was arrested and his home was bombed, but he emerged as a great leader of the non-violent civil rights movement. The boycott lasted 382 days and ended with a Supreme Court decision declaring bus segregation unconstitutional.

In 1957, Dr. King was elected president of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC), formed to provide leadership for the growing civil rights movement. For the next 11 years, Dr. King travelled the country speaking over 2,500 times, leading protests, and acting against injustice. He wrote "Letter from a Birmingham Jail," a manifesto for the civil rights movement, following his arrest during a protest in Birmingham; he told over 250,000 people "I Have a Dream" during a march in Washington, DC; and he led thousands in marches from Selma to Montgomery. At the age of 35, Dr. King became the youngest person to win a Nobel Peace Prize. He gave the prize money to the civil rights movement.

In April of 1968, in Memphis, Tennessee, to support a sanitation workers strike, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., was assassinated. The news shook the nation. Dr. King remains a symbol of non-violence across the world and he is the only non-president to have a memorial on the National Mall in Washington, DC.

1954

 US Supreme Court declares school segregation unconstitutional in Brown v. Board of Education ruling.

1955

Rosa Parks refuses move to the back of a bus in Montgomery,
 Alabama, as required by city ordinance; the Montgomery Bus
 Boycott follows and the bus segregation ordinance is eventually
 declared unconstitutional.

1957

- Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., helps found the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) to work for full equality for African-Americans.
- The federal government uses the military to uphold African-Americans' civil rights as soldiers escort nine black students to desegregate Little Rock High School.

1960

 At the Greensboro Sit-in, four black college students refuse to move from the lunch counter of a Greensboro, NC, restaurant where black patrons are not served, launching sit-ins across the South.

1962

Malcolm X becomes the National Minister of the Nation of Islam.
He rejects the non-violent Civil Rights Movement and preaches
African-American separatism and securing equal rights through
"any means necessary."

1963

- Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., delivers his "I Have a Dream" speech to hundreds of thousands of supporters during the March on Washington, the largest Civil Rights march in history.
- Arrested for a protest in Birmingham, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., writes the "Letter from a Birmingham Jail" a manifesto for the Civil Rights Movement.

1<mark>964</mark>

Congress passes the Civil Rights Act, giving the federal government powers to prosecute discrimination based on race in employment, voting, and education.

1965

 A year after splitting with the Nation of Islam, Malcom X is assassinated in New York City.

- Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., organizes a march from Selma to Montgomery, Alabama. Police beat and teargas protesters; the images are shown on television across the country.
- The Voting Rights Act is passed, outlawing the practices used to disenfranchise African-American voters.

1966

 Huey P. Newton and Bobby Seales found the Black Panther Party, a radical black power group.

1967

 Thurgood Marshall becomes the first African-American justice on the Supreme Court.

1968

- Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., is assassinated. The event sparks riots across the country.
- The Poor People's March on Washington, a march against poverty planned by King before his death, goes on.

SYNOPSIS - April 3, 1968. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. has retired to the Lorraine Motel, Room 306, following his famous speech "I've been to the Mountain Top." As a storm rages outside, the spirited maid Camae arrives with his evening coffee, and Dr. King is swept into an evening discussing his dreams, fears, and his own mortality. In this gripping reimagination of the night before Dr. King's assassination, we witness the story of a man, flaws and all, who despite everything remains an inspiration for generations.

Katori Hall is a Pulitzer Prize and Olivier Award-winning playwright and television creator/producer from Memphis. A two-time Tony Award nominee, she won the 2021 Pulitzer Prize for Drama for her play The Hot Wing King, which she directed for the first time at Atlanta's Alliance Theatre in February 2023. Other works include The Mountaintop, Our Lady of Kibeho, Saturday Night/Sunday Morning, The Blood Quilt, Tina: The Tina Turner Musical and Hurt Village, which is being developed into a feature film. She's also the executive producer and showrunner of P- $V\alpha lley$, the critically acclaimed and ground-breaking Starz drama based on her play Pussy Valley. She is an alumna of Columbia University, A.R.T. at Harvard University and Juilliard. Her other awards include the American Academy of Arts and Letters Award in Literature, the Susan Smith Blackburn Award, Lark Play Development Center Playwrights of New York (PONY) Fellowship, two Lecompte du Nouy Prizes from Lincoln Center, Fellowship of Southern Writers Bryan Family Award in Drama, NYFA Fellowship, the Columbia University John Jay Award for Distinguished Professional Achievement, National Black Theatre's August Wilson Playwriting Award, and the Lorraine Hansberry Playwriting Award, katorihall.com

Playwright's Notes

BY DOROTHY DITTRICH

The Piano Teacher came to me in the form of what I thought was a small intimate story about large feelings and ideas: loss, love, healing and art. At first, it felt like it would be a straightforward process to tell the story, but as I began to get deeper inside the piece, it turned out to be anything but straightforward. Like grief, the process took the time it took, with lots of detours and circling back to pick up a missing piece or add more information.

I wanted to explore the grief process, arguably one of life's most difficult passages and one that is often not easily shared. It occurred to me that putting grief centre stage might be the way to do that exploration. The notion of experiencing and moving through even the most challenging of feelings, rather than trying to conquer, overcome or suppress them, interested me as both a writer and a musician. Something about flow and moving through a feeling struck me as distinctly musical.


I believe in the healing power of music, love, friendship and art and I wanted to write about these beautiful human experiences that are woven in with the difficult.

I confess that like many, I prefer not to linger in the depths, and yet it has been those depths, those dark places that have so often brought me truth, understanding or insight – in short, something of great value.

My family is one of teachers and musicians. This play is a thank you to them as well as to the wonderful teachers from my own past, who have helped me to shape my thinking and beliefs.

I would like to thank those people who helped me develop this play and I would like to thank the wonderful team at Royal MTC. It is truly an honour to have my play produced here in this beautiful theatre.

SYNOPSIS - When Erin, a celebrated classical pianist, loses her ability to play following a dramatic change in her life, she seeks the help of Elaine, a teacher with unconventional methods. Elaine's gentle hand reacquaints Erin with her love of the instrument and over time, a trusting bond grows between the two. As Erin's world begins to transform once again, Elaine finds that she too is deeply affected. *The Piano Teacher* explores the process of moving through grief and the healing power of music and friendship. •



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
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
