- An accompanist will be available upon request for those who plan to sing. Please provide sheet music in advance, or bring it with you to the audition. Artists are also welcome to self-accompany, sing a cappella, or sing to an accompaniment track (please plan for playback on your own device). Please indicate if you will be singing and whether you would like to have an accompanist when you apply.
- Audition slots are 10 minutes total, including time for a brief conversation with the audition panel.
- **Please note:** These auditions are **general in nature**, intended as an opportunity for us to become familiar with your work. They are not connected to specific productions, and participation **does not guarantee casting**.
- Virtual auditions and/or self-tapes will not be seen.
