At the Warehouse we finish our season with *Murder for Two*. At the centre of this production is the incredible talent of its cast and creative team. Casey House

Casey House was founded in 1988 by a group of intrepid volunteers led by journalist and activist June Callwood. It was Canada's first stand-alone treatment facility for people living with HIV/AIDS, and Ontario's first free-standing hospice.

At the time, the average life expectancy for people living with AIDS was nine months. Many people were dying alone, cut off from the support of family, friends and the medical community because of stigma. June Callwood's goal was to create a place of medical excellence in HIV/AIDS treatment and a place of love and compassion. The first client was greeted with a hug – it was the first time he'd been touched in months.

The founders believed that everyone deserved to be cared for with dignity and compassion. They played a leading role in both end-of-life care and HIV/AIDS health care, delivered in a welcoming and homelike environment.

Over the years Casey House evolved from a hospice to a specialty hospital, providing care and support for people living with and at risk of HIV.

SYNOPSIS - In seven days, Princess Diana will be arriving at the Toronto AIDS hospice Casey House. For patient Thomas, this may be the greatest moment of his life. As the current-longest resident of the home, Thomas is determined to bring a new life into the building in preparation for the royal visit, starting with his prickly new roommate Andre, stoic nurse Vera and busy-body volunteer Marjorie. But when his sister Pauline arrives, looking to repair the damage done to their relationship, Thomas must confront their shared past and heal from what has not only occurred to his body, but his spirit. Time is of the essence, because for Thomas, seven days can be a very long time.



Playwright's Notes by NICK GREEN

There are seven things I'd like to say to you before you watch this production of Casey and Diana:

- 1 I really, genuinely hope you like the play and that you're glad you came to see it instead of staying home and watching *The Real Housewives of Salt Lake City*, which is super good this season.
- 2 "Great consideration for one another, that's what's going to save the world." - Casey House Founder June Callwood.
- 3 I've been thinking a lot lately about how to behave during times of great division and intolerance. As much as I aspire to be someone who can meet fear and hatred with strength and kindness, I also understand the need at times to run away and hide for a while. I've run away on a few occasions and I probably will again.
- 4 I am very grateful to Kelly Thornton and the ways that she's supported my career. I think she's quite wonderful and also has a fantastic sense of humour. Thank you, Kelly, for having my play in your beautiful theatre in the gorgeous hub of arts and culture that is Winnipeg.
- 5 Steel Magnolias is just as good the 10th time you watch it. If you're into that sort of thing.



- 6 In the end, once you've exhaled and you're dead, all that's left of you is the impact you've had on other people. Give wisely, because what you give is immortal.
- 7 The Director of this production and my dear friend Andrew Kushnir has a practice of leading us in putting a hand on our hearts and taking a deep breath at the end of a readthrough or run. I like it because it makes me slow down and connect with others in the moment. and as I inhale I feel like I'm pulling in a second in time that is shared and connected to others, and then when I exhale that shared experience is sent out and the world will never really be the same as that second before and it makes me feel very much alive. You know, it might be nice to give it a try at the end of the show you're seeing today. Breathe and connect. Inhale and exhale. Whoosh.

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Director's Notes by and rew kushnir

When I think of Nick's beautiful play, the historic moment it depicts, and the ongoing echoes of the early AIDS pandemic (the past is all around us!), I keep thinking about one thing: the transformative power of compassion. Compassion is a good word. It's an even better thing. Compassion means to suffer with.


In theatre, we hear a lot about *empathy*. That theatre helps us take a walk in someone else's shoes and thereby, hopefully, better understand them and ourselves. I think this is a good thing. But I also think it can be incomplete. We are, sometimes, at risk of taking a walk in those shoes, returning them, and leaving it at that.

Compassion works differently. It's not about borrowing that someone's shoes. it's about taking them by the hand. Metaphorically and literally. It's less about building understanding - because sometimes we can't - and more about simply being there. Presence. Or attunement. Attunement is where attention and affection meet. This is central to the work Casey House has been doing since 1988. Ever since founder June Callwood rallied the community around the idea of providing people dying of AIDS with what she called a "velvet experience". A soft, warm, home-like space for a far-too hard way to go.

Dying of AIDS in the '80s and early '90s was ugly. Opportunistic infections preying on hollowed-out immune systems was only part of it. People with AIDS at this time died social deaths first. In Toronto AIDS wards, furniture was pushed to the extremes of the room. Food was often left in the hospital hallway because workers were too scared to enter a patient's space without a hazmat suit on. Men and women succumbing to AIDS went unbathed, untouched. What's more, too many people with AIDS found themselves abandoned by the families that raised them.

What the heroic nurses, doctors, care teams and eventually a very famous princess did was bring these dying folks back into community. Frank Weller, an expert on grief, writes about how the hormone oxycontin (the "love hormone") is released when we are touched by someone who cares about us and for whom we care: "Genuine community heals the body and soul." There was no curing AIDS but there was a way to help people die in a better, more compassionate, way.

There are still many folks among us both actively and passively grieving the early AIDS era. It was a traumatic time. As a gay man and artist who came out into the chasm left by AIDS, it means the world to me to work on something that honours and acknowledges the grief of those who lost their lover, their uncle. their child, their sibling, their mentor, their best friend. There's no solving that grief, but I do think there's something to making a space for it. To bringing it into community. That grief - your grief - has a place with us. And because we're all grieving creatures (that's just the human condition!), I hope that we can let our losses speak to one another through this play; speak, and laugh, and cry, and remember, and somehow, together, in the dark, feel that little bit lighter. ●



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HIV in Manitoba

Advances in HIV prevention and treatment allow us to envision a day where HIV can be managed as a chronic health condition. Today, however, high incidence of HIV in Manitoba is being driven by a convergence of houselessness, mental health concerns, substance use and socioeconomic issues. The most structurally disadvantaged communities in Manitoba are disproportionately impacted by this crisis including Indigenous people, 2SLGBTQQIA+ people, members of the African, Caribbean and Black communities and people who use drugs. Consider that when we create or sustain barriers to accessing health information and resources, we create the environment to harm those most in need.

Nine Circles Community Health Centre

provides low barrier, culturally safe prevention services, comprehensive care, treatment, advocacy and education for Manitobans susceptible to, or living with HIV, and works to eliminate stigma and advocates for health equities.

Nine Circles was created through an amalgamation of four AIDS Service Organizations (ASOs), which emerged in the late 1980s to early 1990s. Our founding agencies were:

Village Clinic, which emerged as a gay men's health centre and was at the forefront of the community-based response to HIV testing, primary care and treatment.

Kali Shiva AIDS Services, which prioritized volunteer in-home/community supports, peer involvement and empowerment. Kali Shiva would also emerge as an early leader in the advancement of harm reduction in Manitoba.

AIDS Shelter Coalition of Manitoba, which emphasized advocacy and support related to the social determinants of health: housing, income security and social justice.

Manitoba Aboriginal AIDS Task Force (MAATF), which led the response to HIV's impact on Indigenous people of Manitoba including the introduction of Indigenous teachings into prevention and care models, cultural safety and social justice. MAATF's Four Doorways Project was a groundbreaking educational tool that continues to influence HIV education to this day.

This model of HIV care shifted from hospital-based care to community led, where holistic service planning can more easily occur. Nine Circles works with a broad range of partners to ensure prevention, care and support services are available throughout Manitoba including Health Sciences Centre, 7th Street Health Access Centre (Brandon), Aboriginal Health and Wellness Centre, the Thompson Clinic (Thompson) and a growing number of primary care and community partners.







As Manitoba's first openly gay physician, Dr. J.R.M. (Dick) Smith opened the first clinic in Manitoba (and subsequent health centres) to specialize in the care of the 2SLGBT+ communities.

Throughout the HIV/AIDS epidemic and until his retirement at age 76, despite tremendous prejudice and community ignorance, Dr. Smith devoted his career to the understanding, prevention and care of HIV infection. At the onset of the epidemic, when little was known of the disease and treatment was non-existent, Dr. Smith played a leading role in providing non-judgmental and compassionate care to sick and dying young men.

Whodunits

When Marcus Moscowicz confirms that Arthur Whitney has been murdered. one of the suspects asks, "Well, then... whodunit?". Accordingly, Murder for Two is a classic-and musical-whodunit. Whodunit is a colloquial term combining "who" and "done it," and is derived from "Who [has] done it?". The term is largely attributed to Donald Gordon who used it in a review of Milward Kennedy's mystery novel Half-Mast Murder for News of Books in 1930. The subgenre of mystery and detective fiction predates its name but like with the term, there is debate about its origin. One text often credited is Edgar Allan Poe's "The Murders in the Rue Morque," a short story published in 1841. However, cases have been made as far back as Sophocles' Oedipus Rex.

The plot of a whodunit as we know it today revolves around solving a crime, typically a murder. The protagonist whose objective it is to do this, whether they be a professional or amateur detective, is known as the sleuth. A key feature of a whodunit is the double narrative: one narrative is the crime itself that has already been committed, and the other is the investigation of the crime in the present. The crime functions as a puzzle, with the characters and the reader (or audience) solving it simultaneously. Whodunits are often set in remote or isolated locations. as such a setting limits the characters that could be complicit and makes it more difficult for them to come and go-or as we may say with a play, enter and exit! And of course, a whodunit wouldn't be

complete without red herrings. A red herring is a "false clue": something that distracts the reader from the crime or misleads them into believing it was committed by someone other than the actual culprit. This builds suspense and keeps the reader guessing. But why is it called a red herring? Red herring, an odorous cured kipper with reddish flesh, was used by dog trainers to tempt hunting dogs away from the trail they were supposed to be following-in other words, to mislead them. The term was first used in 1807 by journalist William Cobbett, although the technique itself cannot be dated.

One of the most famous whodunit novelists is Sir Arthur Conan Doyle who wrote his first Sherlock Holmes novel, *A Study in Scarlet*, in 1887 and continued to write until around 1927 which was well into what became known as the "Golden Age of Detective Fiction." It was during that time, between the First and Second World Wars, that whodunits populated bookshelves and bedside tables. It was also during the "Golden Age of Detective Fiction" that the "Queen of Crime" Agatha Christie, began her reign. It was none other than the And Then There Were None author who

wrote 66 detective novels, 14 short story collections, and the world's longest running play, The Mousetrap. In 2018, Guinness World Records listed Christie as the best-selling fiction writer of all time; as her website puts it, "outsold only by the Bible and Shakespeare." This is a testament to the enduring intrigue of the whodunit. Whodunits capitalize on insatiable human curiosity and humankind's relentless desire for justice. Whether it's playing "Clue" with your family, watching A Good Girl's Guide to Murder on Netflix, or reading one of Agatha Christie's 66 novels in English class, Whodunit? continues to be a question asked over and over again to this day.
