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

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MESSAGE FROM THE ARTISTIC DIRECTOR



Welcome to the theatre. I am thrilled to bring these two extraordinary plays to the stage.

Paula Vogel's Indecent is more pertinent now than when it made its Broadway debut in 2017. It deals with themes of antisemitism, homophobia, anti-immigration and censorship, and speaks to me not only as a love letter to the theatre, but to the power of art in a fractured society. Spanning nearly 50 years, Vogel's play constructs a ghost troupe as players in Sholem Asch's God of Vengeance, and with this device reveals the broader history of a world where progress and liberalism give way to intolerance and fear. Written when he was 21 years old, Asch sought to address inequities in society. As Vogel describes, Asch

showed women as "flesh and blood." A man ahead of his time, he not only stood up for women's rights, but the rights of all. He strived to show us as "one people, with one common root," and in doing so, wrote something that is truly universal. The intersection of lived experiences in the play is significant, as Asch centres the purity of love as a beacon in a world that seeks to divide us.

King James by Rajiv Joseph is a brilliant play that uses fandom to examine broader ideas of male friendship, as two men grapple with the expectations society has placed on them. Told through four "quarters," like the game of basketball they consume, it traverses through the deep bond and sudden betrayal in their relationship. While their passion for LeBron James unites them, the real nugget of the play is deeper. Beyond the colours of your team, or the career you pursue, at the heart of one's identity is our need for love and friendship to make us whole.

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Sholem Asch

PLAYWRIGHT OF GOD OF VENGEANCE

Sholem Asch was a Polish-American novelist and playwright, who remains one of the most widely known and controversial writers of modern Yiddish literature. Born into a Hasidic Jewish family in Kutno, Poland in 1880, Asch was a talented student

who received a traditional Jewish religious education. While studying, he began teaching himself German and exploring the work of writers such as Schiller, Goethe and Heine. His parents disapproved of these secular studies, so at 17 Asch moved in with relatives in a nearby village. It was there that he first became familiar with the lives of Polish peasants, while working as a letter writer for the illiterate.

By the time he wrote his first play, he was already well known as a Yiddish novelist. At 21, he wrote his third and most well-known play, Got fun nekome (God of Vengeance). Dramatizing the dreams and dilemmas of the Jewish people, Asch became the first Yiddish writer to represent life in the small Jewish towns of Poland to a general audience. Got fun nekome premiered in German as Gott der Rache at Berlin's Deutsches Theater in 1907, and went on to be performed around the world in several languages.

A Journey of Passion

GOD OF VENGEANCE TIMELINE

The following was included in the Playbill for the original Broadway run of *Indecent*. It was compiled by Alisa Solomon.

1907 In Warsaw, Sholem Asch reads his new play, Got fun Nekome (God of Vengeance), for the founding father of modern Yiddish literature, I. L. Peretz. Disturbed by what he takes to be the play's misrepresentation of Jewish piety, Peretz counsels Asch to burn it.

Got fun Nekome opens in St. Petersburg and Moscow, where it is celebrated, and then in New York where the left-wing newspapers defend its gritty sophistication, while the Orthodox papers decry it for fanning antisemitic stereotypes.

1914 With the outbreak of World War I, Sholem Asch leaves Europe for New York. After the war, he visits Europe and is shaken by the destruction of Jewish communities.

1921–22 A movement to prevent lewdness on the stage gathers force against popular farces on Broadway.

1922 Isaac Goldberg's English translation of God of Vengeance opens at the Provincetown Playhouse in New York City before moving to the larger Greenwich Village Theatre.

1923 FEBRUARY 19 - God of

Vengeance opens on Broadway at the Apollo Theater. The passionate scene in the rain is cut from this production, changing the women's relationship from one of love to manipulation.

MARCH 6 - Mid-performance, a police detective informs the cast and producer that they are under indictment for obscenity. The next morning, the company posts bail and returns to the theatre in time for the matinee.

MAY 23 - God of Vengeance company goes on trial and is found guilty. The verdict is overturned on appeal.

1924 The National Origins Act restricts immigration even further; the Asian Exclusion Act lives up to its name. The Society for Human Rights is founded as the first organization in the US that seeks equality for homosexuals. Police pressure soon shuts it down.

1926 New York State passes the Wales Padlock Law, prohibiting plays "dealing with the subject of sex degeneracy or perversion." This law, not declared unconstitutional until 1976, leaves LGBTQ characters to be portrayed as symbols of vice, corruption and evil.

Early 1940s Got fun nekome is performed in the Łodz Ghetto where an estimated 160,000 Jews are sealed off from the world

1942 Nazi officials discuss the "Final Solution of the Jewish Question," and the industrial genocide begins. With news of the murderous destruction of European Jewry, Sholem Asch forbids future performances of Got fun Nekome.

1943 Sholem Asch is the first Yiddish writer to be nominated for the Nobel

1956 Sholem Asch dies. His home in Bat Yam, Israel now houses the Sholem Asch Museum.

1974 Playwright Paula Vogel, then a 23-year-old graduate student at Cornell University, reads God of Vengeαnce at the suggestion of her professor.

1997 While a first-year student at the Yale School of Drama, Rebecca Taichman discovers God of Vengeance and writes her thesis on the obscenity trial.

2010 Rebecca Taichman calls Paula Vogel to collaborate on a play about that obscenity trial, which would later become Indecent.

2013 Indecent receives a developmental production at the Sundance Institute Theatre Program.

2015–2016 The world premiere of *Indecent* is staged at Yale Repertory Theatre, followed by a production at the La Jolla Playhouse. *Indecent* opens off-Broadway at the Vineyard Theatre.

2017 Indecent opens at the Cort Theatre on Broadway, 94 years after the Broadway premiere of God of Vengeance.

An Open Letter by Sholem Asch

Indecent features a cast of actors and musicians performing a play within a play – Sholem Asch's controversial play God of Vengeance. This letter (excerpted below) was published in 1923 in response to the charges brought against the production:

"Because of the wrong interpretation of my play, God of Vengeance, now running at the Apollo Theater, I wish to make the following statement:

I wrote this play when I was twenty-one years of age. I was not concerned whether I wrote a moral or immoral play. What I wanted to write was an artistic play and a true one. In the seventeen years it has been before the public, this is the first time I have had to defend it. ... About two years ago I was approached by New York producers for permission to present the play in English. I refused, since I did not believe the American public was either sufficiently interested or adequately instructed to accept God of Vengeance.

...As to the scenes between Manke and Rifkele, on every European stage, especially the Russian, they were the most poetic of all, and the critics of those countries appreciated this poetic view. This love between the two girls is not only an erotic one. It is unconscious mother love of which they are deprived. In this particular scene, I also wanted to bring out the innocent, longing for sin, and the sinful, dreaming of purity. Manke, overweighed with sin, loves the clean soul of Rifkele, and Rifkele, the innocent young girl, longs to stay near the door of such a woman as Manke.


As to the comment that the play is a reflection on the Jewish race, I want to say that I resent the statement that God of Vengeance is a play against the Jews. No Jew until now has considered it harmful to the Jew. It is included in the repertoire of every Jewish stage in the world and has been presented more frequently than any other play. God of Vengeance is not a typically 'Jewish play.' A 'Jewish play' is a play where Jews are specially characterized for the benefit of the Gentiles. I am not such a 'Jewish' writer. God of Vengeance is not a "milieu" play – it is a play with an idea. Call 'Yekel' John, and instead of the Holy Scroll place in his hand the crucifix, and the play will be then as much Christian as it is now Jewish. The fact that it has been played in countries where there are few Jews – Italy for instance – and that there, the Gentiles understood it for what it is, proves that it is not local in character, but universal.

Jews do not need to clear themselves before anyone. They are as good and as bad as any race. I see no reason why a Jewish writer should not bring out the bad or good traits. I think that the apologetic writer, who tries to place Jews in a false, even though white light, does them more harm than good in the eyes of the Gentiles. I have written so many Jewish characters who are good and noble, that I cannot now, when writing of a 'bad' one, make an exception and say that he is a Gentile."

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Interview with the Playwright

The following is an excerpt from an interview that was conducted between Miriam Weiner, Literary Associate at the Vineyard Theatre, and Paula Vogel, award-winning playwright of *Indecent*.

What was the seed of Indecent?

I read Sholem Asch's play God of Vengeance when I was 23 years old, and I was astonished by it. In 1907. Sholem Asch was brave enough to write that Jews are no different than Catholics or Buddhists or people of any religion, in terms of having people in the tribe who may sell religion for a profit, or who are hypocrites. That's a very hard thing for a man to do, especially in a time of burgeoning antisemitism. Then add in the play's compassionate understanding of the powerlessness of women in that time and place - Asch is a young married man, in a very early work, writing the most astonishing love story between two women - and it makes a pretty compelling play to read and perform.

Why do you think God of Vengeance had such an impact in its time?

God of Vengeance is set in a brothel run by a Jewish man who is attempting to raise his daughter piously, and it features a lesbian love story. When it was performed in New York in 1923, there was deep concern within the Jewish community about what Christians would think. "Do you dare to say this in public? Do you dare to show this in public?" It did exactly what plays should do – it provoked people into talking. God of Vengeance travelled all



over the world, and then it was closed down on Broadway. Today, nearly 100 years after it was shut down, it needs to be produced and talked about still playwrights and new plays should bite the hand that feeds them, and that is what this play did.

Can you think of a contemporary play that has provoked similar outrage?

The plays that I admire, and the playwrights that I admire, are not shying away from the complexity of racism, bias, sexism and the things that hurt us. I'd point to An Octoroon by Branden Jacobs-Jenkins. That is a play that has an insider/outsider perspective. A musical I thought was astonishing was The Scottsboro Boys. It's a brilliant, virulent show and I'm glad The Vineyard's production succeeded in London but it tells me a lot that it wasn't as well-received on Broadway. We are no different than the audiences who sat and watched God of Vengeance.

You mentioned music, which plays an important role in this play. Did you know from the beginning how important music would be to the piece?

Every piece I write starts with music. I can't write until I have a specific soundtrack that correlates to the emotional journey of the play. Even plays like Baltimore Waltz and How I Learned to Drive have a complete score to them. So, right from the beginning, I had songs

selected to write to, though not every song on my writing soundtrack makes it onto the page; sometimes, as the play changes, I spend hours finding a new song to match. As a writer, I don't think that anything I can write has the power that music does. I'm happiest in the rehearsal room when beautiful voices start singing.

What do you think Sholem Asch would make of *Indecent*?

I'm not sure what he'd think. I think Indecent respects him and respects his work and, most of all, feels a great empathy with the kind of pain he felt as a Jewish, Yiddish writer born at the beginning of the 20th century and going through the hideous events of that time. Indecent asks, how do you write in a hideous time? How do you stay true to yourself? What happens if you censor the work that is telling the truth?

How do you see those questions in terms of the theatre today?

So many times we reach for the "classics" to produce; and meanwhile, there are brilliant Americans of colour, women and political writers who, by and large, are kept off stage or out of the spotlight. This can only mean that our discourse will continue to break down. The isolation that America experienced before our

world wars was very detrimental and we are at a point right now where we have politicians endorsing the same sort of isolation. I see it as a very dangerous time, the most divisive moment in politics in my lifetime. I do think we have an astonishing generation of voices right now. In terms of younger artists, this is the best time to write, act and direct. It's never been more important. Hopefully I've encouraged fellow writers and younger writers who will make people feel differently about the world we all inhabit.

Ultimately, what do you hope the audience will take away from *Indecent*?

I don't think of this as a grim play; I think about it as a love story in terrible times. If we love music and theatre and the arts, if we take solace in people sitting beside us in the theatre, if we do what is in our hearts, I think there is light for us. I think the power of us being together in a community gives us light through the darkness. I'm writing this play because, regardless of what I've witnessed in my life, I've never been sorry that I've spent my life in the theatre. I think the power of art is the power to wound our memory. I think the power of art is a way for us to change our world view. I think art is our spiritual bread that we break together.

SYNOPSIS - Spanning 50 years of history, Indecent follows the rise and shocking demise of Sholem Asch's controversial play God of Vengeance. In 1906, Warsaw, a young and newly married Asch pens his first play. When his peers criticize the work, Sholem travels to Berlin and enlists the famous Rudolph Schildkraut to become a member of the company. Wowing audiences across Europe, the ensemble travels to New York where the play takes the Yiddish theatre scene by storm. But when an English translation of the play opens on Broadway in 1923, the play's inclusion of the first same-sex kiss on an American stage proves too scandalous and the entire cast is arrested and charged with obscenity. Refusing to let the play come to an end, the company's stage manager, Lemml, returns the play to Europe amidst dangerous times.

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LeBron James

LeBron James is a professional basketball player widely regarded as one of the greatest of all time. Born on December 30, 1984, in Akron, Ohio, LeBron's talent was evident from high school, where he became a national sensation. He was drafted first overall by the Cleveland Cavaliers in 2003.

LeBron has played for three NBA teams: the Cavaliers, Miami Heat and Los Angeles Lakers. He has won four NBA championships—two with the Heat (2012, 2013), one with the Cavaliers (2016) and one with the Lakers (2020). His remarkable ability to perform in clutch moments, particularly during the 2016 Finals, cemented his legacy.

LeBron has been named NBA MVP four times and has earned multiple All-NBA First Team and All-Star selections. Known for his versatility, he excels as a scorer, playmaker and defender, making him a threat on both ends of the court.

Beyond basketball, LeBron is a philanthropist and businessman. His LeBron James Family Foundation has made significant contributions to education, including funding scholarships and opening a public school in Akron. LeBron has also ventured into media, entertainment and advocacy, using his platform to address social justice issues and champion causes that impact his community and beyond.

Basketball Fandom in Canada

Basketball fandom in Canada is on the rise, becoming one of the nation's most dynamic sports communities. While hockey has long been the cultural cornerstone, the Toronto Raptors' 2019 NBA Championship victory ignited a basketball boom, with "We the North" uniting fans from coast to coast.

The growth extends beyond the NBA. In Manitoba, the debut of the Winnipeg Sea Bears in the Canadian Elite Basketball League (CEBL) has brought fresh excitement. Their inaugural season drew enthusiastic crowds, showcasing the province's appetite for basketball and cementing Winnipeg as a key part of Canada's basketball landscape.

International icons like LeBron James also play a significant role in inspiring Canadian basketball fans. His dominance, leadership and global influence have made him a household name across the country, encouraging a new generation to pick up the sport. From outdoor courts to professional arenas, basketball in Canada is thriving, uniting communities through passion and pride.

From Isolation to Connection:

ADDRESSING MEN'S MENTAL HEALTH

Society doesn't make it easy for men to talk about their mental health and lone-liness. More than one in four men will experience a mental health challenge in their lifetime, yet they are less likely to seek out support than women. We often hear terms like "take it like a man" and "suck it up" and these attitudes worsen mental health concerns by making men feel like they should be alone with their problems for fear of being seen as weak.

Part of the loneliness issue is the reliance on technology and fewer face-to-face interactions with others. A lack of social connection can cause psychological concerns such as depression, anxiety, and increased thoughts of suicide, as well as elevated rates of heart disease, Type 2 diabetes and dementia.

How do we combat this and reverse the trends? Start by making time to reach out to those you care about. By creating a routine, it can reduce isolation and generate positive emotions. As you start looking forward to connecting with

others, neurotransmitters are released: dopamine, serotonin and oxytocin which make you feel happy, excited and loved.

Another great way to combat isolation and loneliness is to be part of a collective or team doing things you love!

Winnipeg has many opportunities to find like-minded people, such as cheering for our professional sports teams, volunteering for the Fringe Festival, or joining a group that has dinner meet-ups in many of our city's great restaurants.

Remember that you don't need to struggle alone and there are many resources available to find help. The Canadian Mental Health Association, Manitoba and Winnipeg (CMHA), has resources available and a navigation hub to connect you to services.

Director's Notes

At first glance, theatre and sports might seem like two entirely different worlds, but *King James* reveals the profound ways they overlap. Both are communal experiences that rely on a shared sense of presence, ritual and emotional investment. They draw people together—whether in an arena or a theatre—to witness stories unfold in real time.

These spaces allow people to connect not just with what's happening on stage or the court but also with each other. To this day I can't drive by the empty lot that was once Winnipeg Stadium without getting a rush of nostalgia. November in the playoffs, and maybe sneaking a few beers in a backpack and getting on the jumbotron. Then maybe running on the field with a Bomber flag, putting the greatest juke move ever on the security guard, but avoiding getting charged because the security office was too full, so they let me go to the open arms of the group of friends I'm still as tight with today as on that day. Tighter. That may, or may not have happened...

At its core, King James is a love story—not romantic, but one about male friendship. It explores the unspoken rules, nuances and tensions of a "bromance," showing how men bond over shared interests and how those bonds evolve over time. Male friendships are often stereotyped as shallow or focused solely on shared activities, but Matt and Shawn push past this, revealing vulnerability and emotion lurking beneath the surface.

In Winnipeg, where sports fandom is vibrant and multigenerational, this debate takes on added resonance. It's not just about basketball; it's about how we connect to the heroes of our youth and how those connections shape our relationships with others. Like hiding in the basement bathroom in the old Winnipeg Arena, waiting to sneak into the sold-out gold medal game at the World Juniors because we couldn't get tickets. Walking around until almost game time, and then making the mistake of sitting in the players-only seats, and being approached by security. Again, this may, or may not have happened... same friends. We've been through A LOT in 30 years.

The play explores friendship, vulnerability and the way we build our lives around the things we love. By staging it in Winnipeg, we have the chance to hold up a mirror to our community, celebrating the ways we come together over shared passions while challenging ourselves to dig deeper into how we express emotion and maintain connection. Like a great game of basketball, it's about teamwork, loyalty and leaving everything on the court—even when it's messy or imperfect.

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






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
