The English Patient, Michael Ondaatje. A severely burned man who doesn't remember his own name is being cared for in an Italian monastery by a Canadian Army nurse. Away, Jane Urquhart. This beautifully written novel follows a family from the Irish famine and over the years as later generations journey to Canada to make a new home and put down roots. Urquhart's poetic novel topped the Globe and Mail bestseller list for 132 weeks. FICTION URQUHART

The Bridges of Madison County, Robert James Waller. This bestselling novella follows *National Geographic* photographer Robert Kincaid and married Italian-American Francesca Johnson after they meet one summer's day. Cold Mountain, Charles Frazier. A confederate soldier who is tired of the war leaves the hospital to head home to Cold Mountain and his love Ada, but his journey is fraught with pain and peril. Meanwhile city-bred Ada, whose father has recently died, must look after the farm on her own until a homeless young woman offers to help her. Both experience loss and hardship in this harrowing tale. Harry Potter and the Prisoner of Azkaban, J.K. Rowling. Harry Potter begins his third year at Hogwarts but something is amiss.
